V2X Wins \$100M Contract to Strengthen Missile Defense in Poland and Advance Transatlantic Security

RESTON, Va., March 11, 2025 /PRNewswire/ -- V2X, Inc. (NYSE: VVX) was awarded a new \$100 million contract to support the U.S. Navy's Aegis Ashore facilities in Poland. These facilities are a crucial component of NATO's missile defense system, designed to detect, track, and intercept ballistic missiles in flight.
