We joined the Final Tree Planting Celebration and it was a meaningful milestone marked by community spirit, celebration, and the planting of the final 10 trees in the program.

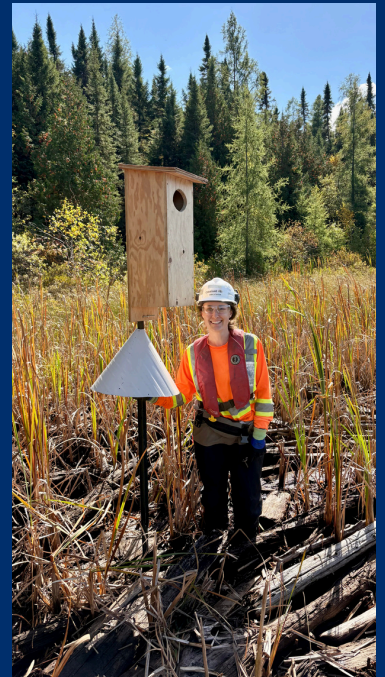


Duck Nesting Boxes Installed on Mattagami Lake to Support Local Wildlife

In September of this year, members of the Environment team set up several duck nesting boxes on Mattagami Lake.

Built for a variety of species such as Wood Ducks, Mergansers and Goldeneyes, the boxes have a predator guard installed to protect eggs and ducklings.

It is expected that ducks will begin checking out the nesting boxes in late winter to early spring, and depending on the species, actual nesting will begin as early as March.

As we wrap up 2025, I want to take a moment to reflect on what we've accomplished and share my excitement for the future of Côté Gold and the communities we work with. We are building something truly exceptional together.

This year, we've continued to focus on operational excellence, long-term value, and a culture built on trust, inclusion, and safety. We are embracing change and innovation at every level, from smarter systems to better ways of working and we know that making this progress together is key to our success.

Operationally, this quarter we continue to see more stable performance from both the mine and mill and we are on-track to meet our mid-year gold production forecast. The annual shutdown in August was successful and work was completed on time and safely. The ball mill was re-lined and a new set of HPGR tires installed with bigger studs. We will continue to modify stud and tire design to improve longevity of the HPGR tires and we are scheduling the next tire change in Feb 2026.

Q4 will be equally important, as we finish the installation of an additional secondary crusher, prep for winter and install more dust mitigation equipment. Significant investment will be made to improve the winter operability of the conveyors and reduce the issues that occurred in Q1 2025.

Thank you to all our employees and community stakeholders for everything you've done this year to support our growth and shared vision. Your dedication and collaboration make all the difference.

Employees Have Fun and Give Back at Sudbury and Timmins Holiday Parties



We celebrated the season together at our annual holiday staff parties in Timmins and Sudbury again this year. As always, there was great company, good food and a chance for Côté Gold employees to give back to their communities!

EXPLORATION AND GROWTH UPDATE

Exploration drilling carried on through the fall, capping off a remarkable year of progress. Over the past twelve months, the team completed approximately 55,000 meters of infill drilling within the Gosselin deposit, successfully advancing most of the resource into the Indicated category.

The Gosselin discovery was made in 2017-2018 by our team resulting from systematic annual exploration programs conducted on our extensive Côté land holdings. Following drilling of the discovery hole (GOS17-05), the team carried out focussed drilling campaigns over the next seven years, transforming Gosselin into a fully defined deposit, an accomplishment that stands as a career highlight for many involved.



PERMITTING UPDATE

Since September 2025 we have received:

- ECA LOF Approval for the addition of phosphoric acid for water treatment
- in the Polishing Pond
- Permit for the Removal of Forest Resources (P10334) was issued for MRA/TMF tree clearing
- Authorization to Destroy a Beaver Dam - North of TMF (SR13/North Gate Road)
- Authorization to Destroy a Beaver Dam - Road west of the OBS (Heading to Sawpeter Lake)
