
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




Claims Map – IMG acquires Sanatana's interest in Claims






Côté Gold Project – EA vs Feasibility









Caroline:

As discussed here is the approvals schedule. I have filtered it to show headings and anticipated First Nations review periods for each permit. Note that outside of these 'official' review periods (durations mimic timelines in the draft IBA documents) we anticipate to discuss and review key permits with you during the preparation; the Closure Plan being a good example.

Other notes:

- In some cases the First Nations review appears to occur very early in the process. That is due to the fact that we anticipate that some permits take up to a year for regulators to approve.
- The list of permits is likely to change somewhat, likely more permits will be added once we get into the meat of things
- Timelines will also move somewhat
- We listed the Transmission Line permit as a line item, but, since other parties are involved, we have not yet been able to nail down all timelines assume that there will be a First Nations review in there somewhere also.

Good afternoon Caroline,

My apologises in taking some extra time to get back to you on the budget and workplan, but as this is an important component of the permitting process, I required time to understand the likely workloads and potential effort needed to review ours submissions and permits.

Please find attached a revised agreement document which is in line with a typical consulting workplan/proposal. I have worked with the previous agreement document as the basis for this revised proposal. What is attached is a rough draft that will require you to finalize based on the needs of the community and the third party support you are providing them. In finalizing the FNP review proposal, we request that the document you return to us for approval is in line with the content and structure of the draft provided.

One area we would like to see more clarity on in the workplan is how the FNP review will focus on material issues relevant to the FNPs areas of concern or interest. Additionally, to align with changes to federal legislation and to be inclusive of the First Nations as partners in the development of Cote, an increased focus on the inclusion of traditional knowledge and culture remain important to us. Focusing the FNP review on material issues will facilitate the permitting process and together will allow us to develop management plans that are inclusive and respectful of First Nation culture and traditions.

I have gone through the budget in detail and I have made numerous adjustments (reductions and additions in some cases) such that the costs are aligned with the expected workloads. Below you will find a summary of the adjustments I have made to the proposed budget.

One area that I will highlight up front as IAMGOLD wants to be sure the community has adequate financial support is that in the draft agreement received, the text indicated that Cote Gold will pay FNP an administration fee which in part funds the FNP to engage a dedicated staff member to support community consultation activities. As this individual is to be remunerated from a portion of the 12% management fee, please review the amount remaining and determine if it remains adequate. It may be advisable to insert a new line specific to the remuneration of the community consultation support. This will provide additional transparency for both IAMGOLD and the FNP leadership. In so doing please adjust the percentage of admin fee down accordingly.

Summary of amendments to budget

Consultation events.

- The January consultation event was intended to provide the communities with an update on the project and seek feedback on the general arrangement. As this timeline was not available to IAMGOLD, it no longer makes sense to have a two-step approach. The EER development is progressing as planned so at this point, we should be focusing on one consultation event, during which, we will provide both an outline of the proposed changes to the project and a summary of our draft EER conclusions. As such, the January event has been deleted from the budget.
- 2. The proposed 32 hours of time required is being limited to 24h chargeable time. This should be adequate time to accommodate all travel, and meetings. IAMGOLD will investigate additional measures such as hiring a Charter flight between Thunder Bay and Timmins to further reduce travel requirements.
- 3. Committee Meetings adjusted to provide 12 hours of time, this should be adequate to accommodate travel and meetings.
- 4. Collectively these time allocations (bullets 2 and 3) are more than reasonable when you take into consideration that the submitted agreement document clearly stated that the "Consultation Committees will occur on the same days as the general community consultation meetings at locations within the First Nation communities". As such, it appears as though there was duplication in the proposed budget and perhaps there still is but I have kept them separate to account for some preparation and follow-up.

EA Conditions review

I adjusted the hours from 28 to 8 for the review of the pipeline information. MNR's concerns in the EA and the subsequent conditions included in the MOECC decision statements that were related to the discharge pipeline are no longer material given the proposed effluent discharge has changed. MNR's major concern was the length and location of the pipeline running up the Bagsverd Creek Valley, which is no longer the case.

SEMP – Here I have <u>added</u> an addition 16 hours of time as the intent of this commitment in the EA was that the process should be led by the community with support from IAMGOLD. So to accommodate that I suggest 56 hours of Caroline's time may be required.

EER

I have reduced a number of the proposed hours based on my understanding of the actual potential for changes in the EER results versus the EA and based on the draft technical documents I have reviewed to date. All hours changed are highlighted in orange.

In summary, I think once, the workplan is finalized and submitted back to us, we will be in good shape to proceed.

If there is any questions about the proposed changes and funding mechanism, I am available to discuss further.

Good morning Steve,

Thank you for your response to the third revision of the budget. Here are a few things for consideration:

1 - the estimated budget is likely to change based on at least 2 factors: the size and scope of the EER and (b) potential changes in the approval conditions. Cote is now a very different project and we cannot at this point anticipate what impact those will have on the budget estimate. This is one of the reasons why we suggested a management approach whereby we review quarterly work scopes and agree upon a more refined budget at that time and based on more concrete information.

2 - regarding reductions in travel time. All travel time is associated with consultation activities in both communities - which, as you well know, are geographically distance from each other. The budget of 48 hours per consultation phase (including preparation, travel, the event itself, and follow up activities) per person is VERY tight and also requires that both communities will be available concurrently in the same week to keep travel expenses minimal.

During our last call on the budget, you indicated that there was no issue with the consultation or expense budgets. To insinuate that Cote would be charged for any minimal time we may spend on other projects during travel time is offensive. Frankly most of the travel time will need to be spent in preparation and follow up activities related to Cote. **Cote will only be billed for the time we spend on the Cote project**. Regardless, the travel budget including that for First Nation representatives is \$50K (expenses) and \$83,640 (consulting fees) and so, making up the \$80K that you are suggesting is impossible from shaving a few hours from travel time.

3- We are increasingly frustrated that there was been no further response on the management approach of advancing quarterly budgets to MFN based on an approved quarterly work scope. Without knowing what, if any alternate management options Cote is proposing, we cannot estimate any subsequent effects of this on the budget.

Finally, my time is very limited today and tomorrow to meet. If you are able to send us your response on the management approach and can meet me after 3 p.m. Wednesday then I can make that work.



Caroline,

I have reviewed these materials and discussed the same with Steve Woolfenden. I understand that Steve W provided comments during a recent call on the proposed budget, which would result in a total allotment of approximately \$300k plus expenses. If you could revise the proposed budget along those lines (the Excel file you forwarded did not reflect those changes, which I understand were previously discussed with you) it would be appreciated.

In terms of the proposed funding agreement, we are not willing to sign that agreement at this time. The proposed funding agreement includes provisions which go far beyond the purpose of the budget. At no point in the past several months has there been any discussion between the parties with respect to negotiating an agreement (other than the IBA itself) that would "provide a framework for on-going consultation and communication with FNP". As you know, discussions on the IBA are on-going – the portions of the draft IBA which relate to such a framework (Schedule F) have not yet been finalized. We would be willing to discuss a more focused agreement that would outline specific terms relating to this proposed budget and work plan. Anything beyond that would need to be tabled for consideration by the parties as part of the IBA negotiations (which can include the development of an interim agreement for such purpose if the parties collectively decide to focus in the near term on such a deliverable). The next scheduled meeting on the IBA negotiations is set for March 8th. To the extent the communities wish to propose developing a framework agreement that would apply during this interim period (e.g., prior to an IBA being finalized and executed), the proper forum for raising such a proposal would be the main negotiation table.

Q. Will the Project bus people from Sudbury and Timmins to the mine site? A. Yes, and the Project will also look at bussing people from Gogama and Mattagami First Nation.

Q. What will the rotational workforce schedule be?

A. The Project currently operates on a 7-on / 7-off schedule and anticipates this may remain for the main workforce with managers and supervisors potentially working a 4-on / 3-off schedule.

Q. Have equipment requirements been identified?A. The Project is looking at equipment options as well as autonomous haulage.

3. COMMENTS

The Project will be looking for feedback on revegetation options for progressive revegetation and for closure. MNO noted that they previously asked that vegetation be replaced the way it was.



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

Summary of Mattagami First Nation Community Meeting Cote Gold Project May 28, 2018

Summary of general issues and interests:

Terrestrial – Eagle's Nests

- There was a concern about disturbance or removal of eagle/raptors nests on the Project site.
- It was clarified that the one eagle's nest near Cote Lake was identified in the previous Environmental Assessments for the Project and that there is a federal approval condition that the nest not be disturbed or removed without prior consultation with MFN.
- MFN members who are aware of other eagle/raptor nests on or near the project site should notify the MFN environmental advisors and/or a representative of IAMGOLD as soon as possible.

Exploration

• It was clarified that there are exploration activities occurring on IAMGOLD leases in the project area concurrently as the Environmental Assessment work is being conducted.

Noise

• There is an interest in knowing what will be the effect of any noise emissions from the new gold processing method.

Archaeology

- There was discussion about who licenses archaeologists (the provincial government) and the protocols for artefacts that could be in the bottom of Cote Lake.
- It was clarified that there must be a First Nation monitor present during gradual dewatering of Cote Lake and a licensed archaeologist will document any artefacts that are uncovered.
- MFN is currently working with Ontario Power Generation (OPG) and IAMGOLD on a plan to store and display the thousands of artefacts that have been found over the past 5 years on the Cote Gold site, and the Mattagami Lake Dam site. MFN will be hiring an artefact coordinator.
- The importance of ceremony in the protocols for dealing with the artefacts was noted. Community members expressed interest in being able to see and touch artefacts – particularly the youth to know more about the history of the region.

Surface and Ground Water

- There was a concern about possible flooding of downstream areas due to the dewatering of Cote Lake and diversion of the streams.
- It was clarified that the water would be discharged into the Mollie River and would flow through the waterbodies downstream including Three Duck Lake.

- Neil Hutchison (environmental advisor to MFN) estimated it would be like pouring a 5gallon tank of water into the river every minute.
- It was suggested that the fish removed from Cote Lake could be given to MFN members for food.
- There was a concern that groundwater springs were not assessed during the previous EA or accounted for as part of the updated project.
- There was a comment that seepage from the Tailings Management Facility would impact downstream water quality and fisheries.

Environmental Monitoring

• There was an interest in having an MFN monitor on site for monitor impacts to fish, water quality.

Mine Closure

- There was a comment that the mine site must be remediated to pre-development (or better) environmental conditions.
- The importance of ceremony at Closure was noted.

Indigenous plant use

• There was a concern that traditional medicines were not assessed during the previous EA or accounted for as part of the updated project.

Consultation Planning

• The need for a plain language presentation of "Mining 101" basics was discussed to help any community members that are not familiar with the mining industry and associated environmental permitting, develop a more in-depth understanding of the project and potentially, more detailed input or concerns.

Socio-economic Conditions

• There was some concern that autonomous trucks would take away potential jobs from community members.

Shining Tree Transmission Line

• MFN and their environmental advisors were not previously aware of the need for a provincial class EA in relation to the 44 km section of the transmission line from Shining Tree to the Cote Gold site.

Any work to review the Class EA is out of the current scope of services funded by IAMGOLD for MFN and FPFN. In future, notice of commencement of any EA process related to the Cote Gold project must come in advance of them being placed in local newsletters. A scope change will be prepared to financially support review of the Environmental Screening Report (ESR).

• Concerns were raised about potential impacts to indigenous traditional land uses from the construction and ongoing operation/maintenance of the transmission line. Known uses and cultural values in the area include use of a traditional trap ground, hunting and several cultural value sites.

The spatial data for the project footprint as well as the transmission line corridors has been requested from IAMGOLD/Wood so that an initial investigation of the potential impacts on

indigenous uses of the corridor and surrounds may be undertaken to inform the ESR and help determine appropriate mitigation, management and accommodations for any potential impacts.

- Use of chemical sprays to manage vegetation along the transmission line corridor and in particular near water crossings was a concern. Chemical sprays adversely impact birds, animals and fish that are harvested for food near transmission line corridors. The approval condition and company commitment to only use mechanical methods for controlling vegetation in the right of way must be honoured.
- MFN experiences chronic power supply shortages throughout the year with debilitating socio-economic effects on the community. MFN needs to know if a system (supply capacity) assessment has been completed and what impacts, if any, there will be on the supply of power to the community.
- There was a concern that there could be an increase in service charges for power to community members as a result of the power line upgrades. It was clarified that the costs to upgrade the power transmission line is borne solely by IAMGOLD.



The study will be carried out in accordance with the Ministry of the Environment and Climate Change Environmental Screening Process for Category B Projects set out in Ontario Regulation 116/01 (the *Electricity Projects Regulations*) and the Hydro One *Class Environmental Assessment for Minor Transmission Line Facilities* under the Ontario *Environmental Assessment Act.*

On completion of the study, an Environmental Screening Report will be completed and made available for a 30-day public review period. A Notice of Completion will advise interested parties of the locations where the report can be reviewed.

Participant Comments and Responses

Q. Are you still doing exploration in the area?

A. IAMGOLD is continuing exploration drilling in the areas proposed for the tailings management facility and the mine rock area to ensure that they will not overprint a gold deposit. The regional exploration program is taking place approximately 30-40 kms in each direction from the Project site.

Q. Can you explain exactly what's going to happen to Côté Lake?

A. Côté Lake is approximately 12 hectares in size with a maximum depth of about 9 feet. It is located directly atop the gold deposit that will become the open pit. The area will be de-watered and the lake will be excavated to become part of the mine.

Q. Is the 44 km transmission line part of the Environmental Effects Review?

A. No, it will be looked at through a separate environmental assessment screening process.

Q. When will construction begin?

A. Construction will begin in early 2019, with tree clearing occurring prior to the breeding bird season.

Q. What do you mean by "discussion" about curation of archaeological artefacts?

A. The Ministry of Tourism, Culture and Sport is working on their processes and the discussion will focus on access to artefacts – the best way to store them, make them available for display and make them accessible for researchers in future.

Q. Could there be marine archaeological resources in Côté Lake?

A. The Ministry has agreed that it would be sufficient to have a licensed archaeologist and First Nation monitor during the Côté Lake de-watering. If any archaeological materials are found, they will be collected and their location identified.

Q. Concern for the potential for effects related to the vegetation clearing in the area where the transmission line will cross Mesomikenda Lake.

A. IAMGOLD has committed to using mechanical means for vegetation clearing and will not use herbicides.

Q. Why were other locations not considered for the placement of mine rock or tailings?

A. IAMGOLD's preference is to keep it all in one area that can be safely managed.

Q. Why would IAMGOLD not put some mine rock back into the pit?

A. This is not a feasible option due to factors such as space and safety during operations.

Q. Why was Mine Rock Area alternative #5 rejected?

A. It is too small to accommodate all of the mine rock.

Q. Why will the New Lake disappear post-closure? We want it to remain once established.

A. This comment is noted, IAMGOLD will investigate options to maintain new lake post closure.





Q. Could any of the mine rock be placed closer to the open pit?

A. IAMGOLD's preference is to keep it all in one area that can be safely managed.

Q. What/where is the scope for the First Nation to review the EA process on the transmission line? A. No class EA is required and it is a two-step process that begins with a screening to determine if further study is required.

Q. What is de-watering?

A. This is the removal of water from Cote Lake. It will be done in stages / levels during which a biologist will be present to monitor the capture and proper care of any aquatic life found and an archaeologist will be present to determine if there are any artefacts in the bed of the lake.

Q. Why is there no First Nation presence during the de-watering process?

A. During the dewatering, which is done in stages, an archaeologist and a FN representative will be present.

Q. How will the artefacts be stored so we can see them? Our children should be able to hold them and learn about them.

A. We are creating a position for and Artefacts Coordinator who will oversee this element of the Project and work towards the creation of a display facility. A questionnaire will also go out to the community to for input as to how they would like to see the artefacts displayed and cared for.

Q. Why does the Ministry of Culture need to be in charge of the artefacts if they belong to us as part of our history?

A. The Ministry of Culture needs to keep all records of artefacts found for the purpose of education and so they aren't lost as others have been.

Q. [related to TMF and MRA] How do you plan on keeping ammonia levels down and also from seeping into the surrounding waterways?

A. Explosives are the source of ammonia. The use of ammonia will be tightly managed, so that there will be very little residual ammonia. Runoff from the MRA and TMF will be captured. With time residual ammonia will degrade. Modelling shows that ammonia in receiving water will meet applicable guidelines. This will be monitored during project operations.

Q. Will the area be monitored after closure to ensure the environment will continue to be protected? A. Yes, the area will be monitored for a long period of time after closure.

Q. Will the fish adapt to the new lake and continue to thrive?

A. Yes, the realignment channels and the new lake are being designed by specialists in a manner such that they will be suitable for local fish species.

Other Comments

- Concerned about the effects of the Project on downstream water quality; fish keep getting smaller.
- Clearing trees will destroy the ecosystem trees produce oxygen.
- Concern over including a ceremonial component to the removal and storage of artefacts. This would need community feedback.
- First Nation members need to be priority on hiring.

Hi Caroline,

As a follow-up to your recent email regarding the proposed June 26th meeting and your previous email as of June 7th, please see the text below.

In general, my view on your suggestion that additional budget and a change order will be required to incorporate one meeting in Toronto, is similar to that I provide to all consultants that work for us. When a consultant has an approved budget that is of a value similar to the approved budget you are working with, we ask that consultants work to manage such minor changes within the existing approved amount. We understand that at some point down the road, this type of management may leave a task short, which we address that that time. So for the time being, please work with your existing total budget to fit in any minor task changes such as the meeting we are requesting in Toronto.

With respect to the proposed meeting on the 26th in Toronto, I would like to put forth the following Agenda:

Toronto June 26th - 10 am start

10 am – 11 am – Review Permitting timelines and requirements – SLR/IMG 11 am – 12 am – Review EA approvals and requirements – IMG/AMEC Noon – Lunch break 1 pm – 2 pm – Summary of UTM Review – Caroline/Rick/Neil 2pm – 3 pm – Review of Community feedback – Caroline/Rick/Neil

As you see in the proposed Agenda, we are requesting that your team provide us a summary of the UTM review and what you have heard from the communities based on meetings held in community. Please let us know if you have any comments on the proposed Agenda.

This information is critical for us to document and consider in completing our EER and being able to demonstrate that IAMGOLD is fulfilling the requirements of the EA conditions to consult with the communities.

Responses to email of June 7th.

Environmental Effects Review (EER):

• We have received Updated Technical Memos (UTMs) for the revised Project. Could you please clarify the relationship between them and the anticipated EER?

Response: Discipline leads were asked to review and assess the optimized Project based on applicable indicators from the EA. The results of their assessments are formalized in the Updated Technical Memos (UTM). The EER presents the context for the optimizations, a summary of each discipline's UTM (in a similar format from the EA) and indicates changes resulting from the optimization.

• What will be the format of the EER? We need to see one synthesized document outlining all the project changes, the new potential effects and how any new predicted effects differ from those originally in the approved EA/EIS for the project. There must be enough information in the EER so that we are not compelled to re-review the EA/EIS document or technical support documents to find information - this will negatively impact our budget allocation for this task.

Response: The EER follows the format of the EA to allow the reader to make a like-for-like comparison when reviewing. The EER compares information presented in the EA and changes are highlighted for ease of review in respective chapters. The EER also states potential effects / mitigations / monitoring proposed in the EA which are no longer applicable resulting from the optimization.

• What is the timing of receipt of the EER?

The EER is currently scheduled for FN review July 27th, 2018.

Consultation and Permitting Schedule:

• Thank you for sending along the permitting schedule. We note that it references the start of consultation with the FNs in early 2018 when in fact it just began with the meetings last week. We communicated to the IAMGOLD team last week, that it will be important to allow for enough time for meaningful consultation with the FN communities, committees in the planning process - as such we will treat the schedule as a guideline rather than ridged, unless you wish to revise it.

Response: The schedule line item is a placeholder which reflects IAMGOLD's commitment for the inclusion of FN communities in the Cote Gold Project. The specific line item references when budgets and scoping begin to be properly prepared when discussing with FN communities to prevent delays during consultation discussions and when receiving information requests.

EA Conditions:

• May we receive a schedule that reflects all the EA conditions that require participation and inputs from the FNs please? There were a number of conditions that had timelines attached to them - e.g., Compliance Monitoring Program - 60 days prior to construction.

• You may wish to incorporate that at the end of the permitting schedule to keep everything in the same place.

Response: Your attention to IAMGOLD's Cote Gold Project EA conditions is appreciated. IAMGOLD has developed a conditions table which was incorporated in to the schedule and linked to associated tasks. We are currently updating the EA conditions table in light of the EER to prevent any duplications of efforts.

Shining Tree TL Environmental Screening Report:

• Our team would like to clarify if the TL ESR is in fact referenced in the schedule as: "Approval of Transmission Line" (line #291) - if so, then we have some budget scope to review the Screening Report.

• We note that the budget allotted to us may not be sufficient given: (a) some of the concerns we heard during the meetings last week, (b) the need for discussions with the MFN family with the impacted trapline to ensure those concerns are reflected in the review, and (c) the need to review any other associated permits (i.e., IESO Connection Assessment and Approval process; OEB leave to construct and the MNRF Land Use Permit) - none of which are identified in the permitting schedule.

Response: The Screening process is the approval of the Transmission Line that is referenced in the schedule. To date, we are not aware of any justification to suggest that the construction and operation of the transmission line will impact trapline use or success, as such, it is premature to suggest otherwise. With respect to the IESO Connection Assessment and Approval process, we do not see this as an issue for the communities given the line will be dedicated to IAMGOLD.

• We have requested and would like to follow up on when we will receive a copy of the schedule for FN participation in the preparation of the ESR as well as in its review (absent in the permitting schedule).

Response: If the ESR being referred to here is related to the Class EA process for the Shining Tree Transmission Line, the requirement for such a report is only needed if an issue cannot be addressed during the screening phase. Our intent is

to follow the process closely, as such, we will only move to prepare an ESR is we have not mitigated any issues raised during the screening consultation phase.

• Further, as requested last week, we would like receive a copy of the spatial data for the TL and mining project footprint in Google Earth/KML and ArcGIS formats so that we can work with the FN lands departments to better understand effects of the TL and mining footprint on known and documented FN land uses.

Response: As you may recall, IAMGOLD funded a TK/TLU study prepared by Mr. Mckay on behalf of both FPFN and MFN. Since that time, IAMGOLD has not been made aware of or provided any additional TK/TLU information that would warrant further geospatial analysis.

MOECC and CEAA Compliance Officer contacts:

• Steve - we have reached out directly to MOECC and CEAA to obtain contacts for compliance branch so we may have direct discussions if needed with them. So, no need to respond to my email request of May 31 on this matter.

As discussed at our meeting June 26, that these are strictly information requests related to the UTMs that will help our team better understand the new environmental effects of the revised project designs so that we will be better able to serve our First Nation clients in the EER review. We have focused our information requests on areas that are of concern to the First Nations which has been documented in the previous EA as well as recently in the community meetings held in late May.

We are also, as their technical advisors, responsible for identifying and asking questions about other areas of potential concern with the UTMs/EER - such as with the robustness of the baseline data or assessment methodology - so that we have confidence in the results of the assessment and can discuss them more effectively with the communities.

We are implementing an internal review process whereby the First Nations have an opportunity to review our submissions to IAMGOLD and flag any concerns they have with them.

In all future submissions to IAMGOLD, we will copy the Chiefs and / or any delegates from the community as directed by them.

Summary of Discussion

1. PERMITTING TIMELINES AND REQUIREMENTS

- Ontario Water Resources Act change \rightarrow Exemption of Domestic Water Permit
- Intent to get Early Construction Permits for next summer
 - These are needed to begin construction on the TMF starter dam next autumn
- Potable Water permit will be pushed back in the timeline as it is not needed for the Chester Camp (but will eventually be needed for the accommodation complex)
- Domestic Sewage permit will also not be urgently required for construction of the Chester camp, thus will be pushed back from this summer
- Mobile units are preapproved and meet discharge criteria (come with their own ECAs). Because these are short term units, there is no community concern about applying for permits. FNP would like to receive a copy of the ECA and conditions associated with the permits from the manufacturer.
- Wood currently preparing screening report for the Transmission Line EA, intent to finish in July
- Permit to Take Water for Fresh Process Water and Camp Water from Mesomikenda Lake will be pushed out a couple of weeks, as Wood has not received the numbers from the design team regarding how much water is needed
- LRIAs (Lakes and Rivers Improvement Act) to be "packaged" in terms of when certain pieces are required (In stages 1 and 2)
- Intent to remove all dams (except tailings) at closure, but keep the new lake
 - Pit will acquire water through natural processes, accelerated fill methods being investigated (estimated 25-30 years)
- Still confirming which fish habitats are being offset; enough information will likely be gathered by the end of July to start the conversation surrounding the Fisheries Act authorizations.
- Rick will lead permitting piece for FPN until September.
- Biweekly calls/meetings for check ins scheduled starting July 5th, every other Thursday at 1pm (July 5th, July 19th, Aug 2nd, Aug 16th, etc.)

2. EA APPROVALS AND REQUIREMENTS

- Provincial Condition 9 considers every community which IAMGOLD has engaged with
 - Working on correspondence with these communities to confirm their continued involvement
 - Intent to customize which information is shared with each community, by relevance/desire





- Compliance Monitoring Program (#5 in Budget Table) does not distinguish between public and anyone else. It also does not require consultation, just that it be submitted 60 days prior to construction.
- Communities will all be notified of and receive information on any conditions which have public notification / consultation requirements.
- Part of the EER will outline which conditions IAMGOLD considers no longer applicable as a result of the optimized Project layout.
- Consultation Plan: Wood will develop one consultation plan which satisfies all CEAA and MOECC requirements related to Indigenous consultation/engagement and will look for feedback on this.
- IMG's target for IBA completion is the end of this calendar year.
- FNP / IMG looking for ways to allow voices within communities to be heard:
 - FNP suggested more personal meetings with communities to discuss concerns and issues while building relationships (Committees inviting Christian? Youth Council? Elders Council?)

3. UTM REVIEW

- Complete formal comments to be submitted from FNP to IMG
- Key questions / comments related to initial review are listed below

Air / Noise and Vibration / Visual Aesthetics

- Concern regarding CAQS standards on Nitrogen Dioxide levels
- Questions about the air quality and noise for workers on site / in the camp
- Were non-Project sources of noise fully included in the model?

Surface Water Quality / Hydrogeology

- Concerns with the unchanged local study area boundary after the TMF was moved
- Interaction between TMF and Bagsverd Lake. Why is there seepage into Bagsverd Lake? Most of TMF is in Mollie drainage (not Bagsverd).
- Concerns with using the 95th percentile as a quality standard in lakes
- Interest in reviewing new baseline data collected
- Wish to see model of new discharge point
- Concern with applicability of EA following changes to the Project

Hydrology

• Appendix and text values don't match

Biological Environment

- May need to get some more detail on effects comparison
- Concerns with unclear methodology for conclusions in aspects such as terrestrial biology

- Interest in having an on-site monitor to monitor the effects on fish and water quality
- Comment that site should be restored to pre-mine conditions or better
- Concerns that traditional medicines were not assessed or accounted for as part of the updated project
- Interest in ensuring that language is understandable by all parties (terminology and jargon)
- Concerns about autonomous trucks taking away driving jobs





- Questions about potential impacts to tradition land uses
- Concerns about the use of chemical sprays
- Concerns about impacts on supply power to the community

Flying Post First Nation:

- Enthusiasm about employment opportunities
- Some interest in involvement with the artifact pieces
- Questions about development certainty

Meeting Notes

IAMGOLD provided an update on the status of the Closure Plan. There had been discussions taking place amongst engineering about making some changes to the mine plan. These discussions have been resolved and the current scenario that has already been brought to the communities is still moving forward with considerations for future mining scenarios. An updated permitting schedule will be provided by IAMGOLD during the week of July 23.

Dear Steve,

We write in relation to the Draft Closure Plan for the Côté Gold Project, and to advise of some concerns regarding the incompleteness of this document, the proposed timeframe for consultation with our First Nations, and the lack of an Environmental Effects Review (EER), which has yet to be provided for review and consultation with our First Nations.

The Closure Plan is an important document for our First Nations since it describes the quality of the environment after IAMGold has left the site, the measures that IAMGold is to implement in rehabilitating the site, the expected costs of those measures, and the amount of financial assurance that IAMGold is prepared to provide. The reality is that long after IAMGold or any potential future operator of the Côté Gold Project has left the site, our First Nations will be here. It is critical that we have confidence that the Closure Plan sets and achieves high standards for site rehabilitation, and that an appropriate level of funds is set aside to achieve those standards.

On July 23, 2018, Mattagami First Nation and Flying Post First Nation received a copy of a Draft Closure Plan for review and comment. On July 26, 2018, we received a copy of IAMGold's schedule for project approvals and First Nation consultation, which indicated a consultation period on the Draft Closure Plan of forty (40) business days commencing on July 23, 2018. Today, we received IAMGold's updated schedule indicating a date of September 14, 2018 for conclusion of consultation on the Draft Closure Plan. We believe that this date is both unjustified and unwarranted for the reasons outlined below. We would like to discuss alternative arrangements with IAMGold.

Process and Funding Agreement

As you are aware, in April 2018 our First Nations and IAMGold entered into a Process and Funding Agreement, in relation to the EER, permit applications, and environmental assessment

conditions. The terms of this Agreement include a number of provisions related to the permit application review, including in relation to the Closure Plan:

- the timeframe for consultation begins upon receipt of a "substantially complete draft application" (s.5.3);
- a new closure plan constitutes a "Major Permit" for which the timeframe for consultation is forty (40) business days (s.5.3);
- consultation on a "Major Permit" requires direct consultation in the form of one or more meetings with the First Nations by IAMGold, as the Operator of the Côté Gold Project (s.5.4);
- the First Nations must make reasonable efforts to facilitate these meetings in the communities, and shall not use failure on our part to arrange such meetings as evidence of a breach of the Agreement or failure to consult on the part of IAMGold (s.5.6)
- the First Nations and IAMGold must use reasonable efforts to achieve consensus on the content of the Closure Plan prior to the submission of the Closure Plan to the Ministry of Energy, Northern Development and Mines (MENDM) (s.5.7); and
- the First Nations, upon providing reasonable justification, may request from IAMGold additional time for technical review or for consultation on Permits, and IAMGold shall give reasonable consideration to granting such requests (s.5.8).

Incomplete Draft Closure Plan

Upon receipt of the Draft Closure Plan, one of our initial observations in reviewing the document was that important information related to Closure Plan cost estimates and financial assurance was conspicuously absent. On July 31, IAMGold informed our technical advisors by email that these sections of the Draft Closure Plan were the subject of discussions IAMGold was planning to have with MENDM "in the coming weeks", and that this information would only become available with the release of the Côté Gold Project Feasibility Study and submission of a Closure Plan to the MENDM.

On August 2, during the first bi-weekly environment meeting following receipt of the Draft Closure Plan, our technical advisors noted that it is common for First Nations and mine proponents to have different visions regarding the objectives of mine closure as well as different perspectives on the costs to implement the contemplated closure measures, both of which can contribute to meaningful differences in the estimate of closure plan costs. At that meeting, our technical advisors again requested that IAMGold provide the cost and financial assurance information since it is an essential part of the application. IAMGold has yet to provide this information.

The First Nations need be confident in the cost estimates, and the amount and form of financial assurance, in addition to the other measures proposed in the Draft Closure Plan. Until information related to Closure Plan cost estimates and financial assurance is included in the Draft Closure Plan, it will not be possible for our First Nations and IAMGold to achieve consensus pursuant to s.5.7 of the Process and Funding Agreement. The Draft Closure Plan is not substantially complete and, according to the Process and Funding Agreement, the timeframe for consultation on the Draft Closure Plan begins only once the missing information is provided.

Environmental Effects Review

We also remain concerned about the status of the Environmental Effects Review (EER). The EER is a condition of both the provincial and federal governments' environmental assessment approvals and is important to determine whether there are new adverse environmental effects from the revised Côté Gold Project, and the significance of those effects.

We were initially informed in December 2017 that the EER was to be provided to our First Nations for review in March 2018. While we received appendices to the EER in the form of Updated Technical Memos (UTMS) in May 2018, we have yet to receive the main EER report. On July 6, 2018, we provided comments on the UTMs for which we have yet to receive a response from IAMGold. On July 26, 2018, IAMGold delayed provision of the EER to the First Nations to August 27, 2018. Today, IAMGold acknowledged that the earliest date for providing the EER is now September 10, 2018. We remain concerned that this date will not be achieved.

Our review of the Draft Closure Plan is constrained by the lack of clarity concerning the environmental effects of the revised Côté Gold Project, including the significance criteria for comparison with closure plan objectives. This clarity could be provided through provision of the EER to assist our First Nations in our review of the Draft Closure Plan.

First Nation Review and Consultation

Despite the fact that IAMGold has yet to provide a substantially complete Draft Closure Plan or the main report of the EER, our First Nations have continued in good faith to organize community consultation sessions respecting the information that IAMGold has provided.

Our First Nations met with IAMGold to discuss closure concepts in relation to the prior version of this project during the environmental assessment. We also arranged for IAMGold presentations and meetings in our communities to discuss the revised Côté Gold Project during the last week in May of this year. To be clear, discussion of closure concepts during an environmental assessment of a different project is not the consultation required under the Process and Funding Agreement, which is specific to the Closure Plan for the revised Côté Gold Project.

We are also pleased that IAMGold has accepted our invitation to attend community meetings scheduled for August 30 in Mattagami First Nation to discuss the Draft Closure Plan. We were not able to secure a date in August for a meeting in Flying Post First Nation (FPFN) to discuss the Draft Closure Plan due to the summer holiday season and other prior commitments. We are continuing to plan for a meeting with FPFN in mid to late September and will advise IAMGold once suitable dates are identified.

In order for the First Nations and IAMGold to be in a position to reach consensus on the Draft Closure Plan, the Process and Funding Agreement requires provision of the Closure Plan cost estimates and financial assurance information in advance of submission of the Draft Closure Plan to the MENDM. Since IAMGold has provided some information in the Draft Closure Plan, we do not believe that it would be necessary to commence the 40-day consultation period only upon provision of the Closure Plan cost estimates and financial assurance information.

However, additional discussions with our communities concerning this important information will be necessary and, depending on the nature and extent of the differences of views between IAMGold and our First Nations respecting this information, additional community meetings may be required. We anticipate up to twenty (20) business days would be appropriate to review, consult and attempt to achieve consensus on this information, presuming the timely cooperation of IAMGold. For example, if the Closure Plan cost estimates and financial assurance information is provided by August 31, we would attempt to conclude review and consultation and reach consensus by September 28.

Overall, the untimely provision of information and documents by IAMGold is leading to both time and cost inefficiencies in the consultation and review process. The desire on the part of IAMGold to impose deadlines to the consultation process despite providing incomplete information for our review is not consistent with our agreement and is unacceptable.

We are prepared to discuss this issue further with IAMGold at our scheduled meeting on August 29, 2018 in Toronto.

Dear Mr. Petersen:

We have received your request for an extension to review the Draft Closure Plan prepared by IAMGOLD.

Respectfully, IAMGOLD is of the opinion that the Draft Closure Plan provided to the community is a substantially complete mine closure plan, which sets out the objectives of the closure plan as well as the proposed reclamation approach(es) which as the operator we will implement at the end of the operations phase.

The cost estimates were not provided to the communities as estimation of future reclamation costs is essentially a technical exercise driven by the draft plan. In planning for closure, we seek to determine the objectives for the land use post mining and the best available methodology to achieve defined objectives. We do not base the plan purely on costs.

Attached to this letter is the Draft Chapter 12 which includes a summary of the closure costs, additionally attached is more detailed estimate of the costs, which demonstrates the depth of the exercise we undertake in determining our future asset retirement obligations over the life of the mine.

IAMGOLD has also prepared a draft submission of Chapter 13 which proposes a financial assurance for the construction phase and initial operations phase. That submission is being prepared in accordance with the Mining Act and its regulations. Similar to the mine closure costing, this exercise is mainly a process of applying existing law and regulation.

As noted above, the cost estimation process is a technical exercise that is driven by the details of the plan – the cost estimation does not impact the scope of undertakings which IAMGOLD is proposing under the Draft Closure Plan. In the event the actual costs of closure exceed the estimate in the future, IAMGOLD as the operator will remain obligated to execute on the approved Closure Plan regardless of the initial cost estimates. In terms of the accuracy of the total costs, it should be note that Ontario law and IAMGOLD policy require that mine closure costs estimates be updated every 5 years throughout operations and that we annually review and publicly report on our Asset Retirement Obligations.

For the foregoing reasons, we intend to submit the Draft Closure Plan application to the Province within our proposed timing of September 14th. As part of that submission, we will note that we have recently provided the estimation of the total costs of the plan and the proposed application of financial assurance requirements to the communities. We will also note that the community may have further comments on those elements or on the Draft Closure Plan itself that may be submitted separately (all in accordance with Section 5.7 of the Process and Funding Agreement).

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In terms of Direct Consultation on the closure plan, IMG remains of the view that it has completed Direct Consultation with both communities (both in 2018 and through the original EA/EIS process, which contained fundamentally the same approach to closure) on the key elements of the Draft Closure Plan. Those elements on which Direct Consultation have been completed are not expected to change in the draft application, subject to any further comments from the communities received prior to Sept 14th. We also do not anticipate them to change as a result of the cost estimation process or application of financial assurance requirements under Ontario law or policy.

It should be noted that the Province will separately consult with the community on the Draft Closure Plan following the submission of the initial application by IMG. Also note per Section 5.7 of the Process and Funding Agreement, the consultation process is not closed once the application is submitted, under that Agreement, the Crown's duty to consult is only deemed to be satisfied if (a) a consensus position is reached by the parties on the draft application; and (b) the Crown accepts that consensus position. If no consensus position is reached by the parties, either at the submission date of the initial application or at any point thereafter, the duty to consult will not be deemed to have been satisfied for the purposes of the Agreement.

In regards to your request to receive the EER, I would like to point out that the communities have received all of the updated technical memos which form the basis of the Environmental Effects Review. The final EER report is currently being finalized and will be shared shortly. However, it will only provide a summary of findings documented in the technical memos which have previously been disclosed to the communities. As set out in those memos, the proposed changes to the project will not result in any significant adverse environmental effects. In fact, we expect that the proposed changes to the project will result in a reduction in total environmental effects in comparison to the initial project design set forth in the original EA/EIS.

Ontario Mining Act Fact Sheet

In Ontario, a mining company cannot commence mining operations until a certified Closure Plan and associated Financial Assurance are in place.

In planning for closure, there are four key objectives that must be considered:

- 1. Protect public health and safety;
- 2. Alleviate or eliminate environmental damage;

3. Achieve a productive use of the land, or a return to its original condition or an acceptable alternative;

4. To the extent achievable, provide for sustainability of social and economic benefits resulting from mine development and operations

Where does Closure fit within the life of a mine?

A Closure Plan is required before a proponent starts advanced exploration. Even if the proponent doesn't plan to start mine production for a number of years, if any activities that the company is undertaking trigger a Closure Plan requirement, it must submit a Closure Plan, as required under the Mining Act. The Ontario Mining Act requires progressive rehabilitation throughout the life of the mine. The "active" stage of closure and rehabilitation requires 2 – 10 years, while monitoring to ensure the physical and chemical stability of the environment can last for decades, if not centuries.

When is a Closure Plan prepared?

A mining company must prepare a Closure Plan before starting (or re-starting) advanced exploration or starting (or re-starting) mine production.

What is the objective of a mine closure plan?

A Closure Plan describes measures, including protective measures, that the mining company takes during the entire life of the mine to rehabilitate the mine site. These rehabilitation measures aim to restore the site to its former use or condition or to make the site suitable for a use that the Director of Mine Rehabilitation determines. The Closure Plan includes a requirement that the company post a financial assurance to cover the costs of rehabilitation to protect the taxpayer in the event of a corporate default.

What happens if a mine is sold?

An approved Closure Plan is transferred to the new owner of the mine. The new owner, however, must provide adequate Financial Assurance in an allowable form before the property is transferred.




Figure 3-project infographic

Meeting Notes

IAMGOLD provided a response via email regarding agenda item #1 on July 31:

"With respect to item #1 on the proposed agenda, IAMGOLD would like provide a point of clarification about the draft Cote mine closure plan you received. In the initial planning and discussions with the communities, it was discussed that IAMGOLD would be producing a mine closure plan that was scoped to the construction phase of the mine and potentially included the first three years of operation. IAMGOLD WAS subsequently advised that the province requires a





full Life of Mine plan, as such, the draft plan you received considers the full build out and operations of the mine revised mine plans. The benefit of preparing a full LOM closure plan is that the communities have the opportunity to comment on our vision for the site once operations cease and the progressive reclamation opportunities.

With respect to the draft document content, IAMGOLD notes that we have not provided Chapters 12 and 13. These chapters include the cost tables and specifics of the financial security. These sections are subject to discussions IAMGOLD will have with MENDM in the coming weeks. Information related to the anticipated closure costs will be available with the release of the FS and closure plan submission to MENDM."

1. Closure Plan

- Consultants for FPFN/MFN inquired as to latitude on date for comments as they will be reviewing it next week but will be unable to present their review to FPFN until after Labour day and possibly not until a couple of weeks into September. The request for an extension beyond the agreed-upon 40 days is not reflective of the time needed for the consultants to review the documents but their ability to present it to the community.
- IAMGOLD noted that the community had previously agreed to the timelines and 40 business
 days was anticipated to be sufficient to review the Closure plan and present information to the
 communities. IAMGOLD informed FNP that a delay in review of the CP means a delay on
 approvals and construction. IAMGOLD mentioned that if an extension is being requested then a
 formal request in writing with detailed reasons as to why then IAMGOLD would consider.
- IAMGOLD informed FNP that the draft CP will not include financial appendices and the closure costs will be included in the feasibility report and will be made available by feasibility team.
- FNP indicated to IAMGold that differences of vision between FNP and IAMGold related to the Closure Plan objectives and state of the site at closure often result in different views about costs, and FNP is requesting the cost tables for discussion with IAMGold in advance of submission of the Closure Plan to MENDM to try to resolve any differences of views.

2. Transmission Line Screening Report – clarification on review timeframes

- The current schedule outlines the timeline allowances to be in business days.
- IAMGOLD will know by August 6 if the screening report will be issued or if IAMGOLD will move directly to developing the Environmental Study Report.

3. Approval Conditions

• FNP interested in having a schedule showing when conditions of approval will be fulfilled (e.g., management plans, monitoring programs)

4. Schedule format – suggest one that better facilitates community consultation planning

• SLR will draft changes to the schedule to reflect the permitting conditions and Indigenous consultation at the required stages.

Introduction

Mattagami First Nation and Flying Post First Nation ("First Nations") received from IAMGold on July 23, 2018, the following document for review and comment in relation to its proposed Côté Gold Project ("CGP"):

• SLR Consulting Ltd. July 2018. Draft Closure Plan Côté Gold Project. Prepared for IAMGold.

(the "Draft Closure Plan")

The First Nations technical reviewers are providing these **preliminary** comments to support discussions between the First Nations and IAMGold concerning the Draft Closure Plan. Further discussion of these preliminary comments will occur with the First Nations, including at our scheduled meetings on August 30, 2018.

Our review of the Draft Closure Plan was undertaken without the benefit of having received in advance the "Environmental Effects Review" (EER) document. As such, there is a lack of clarity concerning the environmental effects of the Côté Gold Project, including the significance criteria for comparison with closure objectives and the closure plan more generally.

During our preliminary review we observed that the Draft Closure Plan does not contain a completed Table 12-1: Closure Cost Estimate for the Côté Gold Project, and is also missing materials concerning the Financial Assurance. **The First Nations require a substantially complete Draft Closure Plan, including the Closure Cost Estimate and Financial Assurance information, in order to undertake our review and consultations within the First Nation communities.** The First Nations previously requested this material from IAMGold, including at our meeting on August 2, 2018. Despite our requests, IAMGold has not provided this information and has informed the First Nations that it is not intending to provide this information for review prior to the submission of the Closure Plan by IAMGold to the MENDM. This matter is addressed below in the specific comments.

These preliminary comments may be revised or resolved, or new issues may arise, following discussion with the First Nations, upon receipt of the EER or upon receipt of the closure cost estimate and financial assurance information.

The First Nations expect that any issues raised by these comments will be reviewed and considered by IAMGold, and that IAMGold will engage directly with the First Nations in discussions about how to incorporate and adopt these comments into the Draft Closure Plan, and into future IAMGold activities.

The Draft Closure Plan represents one step in the process by which the First Nations may be adequately consulted and accommodated, and the provision of these comments does not, in itself, indicate that there has been adequate consultation and accommodation of the First Nations by IAMGold. The First Nations reserve all rights to revisit the issues raised in the Draft Closure Plan, and to make further comments on the Draft Closure Plan, or the Côté Gold Project at any time.

For greater certainty and recognizing that IAMGold is solely responsible for instructing its consultants, any use, re-use or reliance by IAMGold on these comments, including but not limited to any advice or recommendations, for the purposes of project design, engineering, planning, management, construction, operation, environmental protection, rehabilitation or for any other purpose whatsoever is at the sole discretion and risk of IAMGold. The First Nations, their consultants and advisors have assumed and accept no responsibility or liability for actions taken or not taken by IAMGold with respect to these comments.





Site Visit

Members of IAMGOLD met with Chief, councillors and community members as well as the FN consultants at the Cote Gold project site and went on a tour of the project area. IMG explained where project elements would be including the TMF and the open pit.

A formal agenda was not provided to IMG prior to the meetings. Upon arrival at the hall IMG read the agendas provided on the tables set for community members which stated that the presentation on the Closure plan would be done by IMG and when asked for clarification on this, were informed that they would be making the presentation. During previous teleconferences with the FNP, IMG was clear that they would be there to participate in answering questions after the Closure plan review was presented by the consultants but would not be making a presentation. However, IMG brought presentation items in the event that they were needed as details of the meeting were unclear and set up numerous display boards and ran a visual presentation as well as providing the August 2018 Let's Talk newsletter.

Presentation highlights

- IAMGOLD explained what a closure plan was and why it is required and assured those in attendance that IAMGOLD is a company with experience with safety and closure of mine sites. IAMGOLD is continuously working on improving standards across the board including external auditing
- Closure activities are done as the project is live and as mine activity progresses, this is considered good practice in mining.
- The closure plan is a living document, over the years of the life of the mine the plan is updated based on changes e.g. New technology and methodology
- Every 5 years there is a requirement to review the Closure Plan. It is IAMGOLD's practice to include the community in this process
- IAMGOLD is looking to hear from the community and their interest in the outcomes of closure, these are important to IMG to know as interests and ideas can change over the years
- The rock found in the Project area is aggregate grade material and of a large volume, this could be a potential business opportunity for the community. Testing has indicated that the rock is Non Acid Generating with low metal leaching potential.
- Objectives for land use post mine are included in Closure Plan updates and can be on going during the life of the mine

Participant Questions and Answers – Afternoon Session

Q. Does the first nation have a say? When will you come back to update?

A. Yes, input is appreciated. Community input on what they want to see at the end of the mine life is very important to IAMGOLD

Q. How do you recover traditional medicines?

A. Using seeds from species targeted to replant the area, preferable by harvesting seeds from plants on site. The tailings are tested to determine if the target vegetation will take. Even after closure the vegetation put there is monitored and if it found to not be thriving adjustments are made to ensure vegetation takes – dependent on the objective of closure whether it is to make the area green or to hold onto plants that are currently there naturally

It's important to have a study done to determine what plant species are there, to be documented as part of the priority species to ensure they are included in the revegetation plan. Some traditional plants are only harvested once a year so if it doesn't take maybe it never will

- Q. Where is the best place to document updates?
- A. Updates to closure plans are formally filed with the Ministry

A. Consultation summaries are given to MNDM which include comments from the community on the closure plan and this is filed as well

Q. What examples can you give to show that a closure plan of this detail having succeeded? A. Although this is not something that IAMGOLD has done, we believe your independent consultants could provide this to you

Q. If we are going to sporadically vegetate, what outcome can we expect to see and if we are already aware that there is not enough overburden to put back how can you ensure vegetation will take?

A. keeping in mind that this area does already contain much rock outcropping naturally, IAMGOLD is committed to returning the area to its previous state as closely as possible

Q. What is overburden?

A. Overburden are the layers of soil about a foot deep. Some can be gravel/rock and other areas are soil good for plants

Q. What we need to understand is this is what is here now and this is what will be here due to the mine. To be able to understand a visual of the changes

A. This information is all available in the Closure Plan which your consultants have and it is within their scope of work to provide this information to you in a way that is suitable and understandable

Q. How do you ensure future use of the site and get feedback from the community on this?A. Future generations will have their input and knowledge included with updates to the Closure Plan which will be done consistently throughout the life of the mine

Q. How long does closure take and how do we know you won't just walk away like so many other mining companies have in the past

A. The first 2 years of closure is the removal of infrastructure. Further closure involved the company monitoring the reclamation efforts, which are contracted out to a company who specializes in this activity, until the site is returned to as near original as possible. Monitoring then continues for as long as necessary, in perpetuity if need be.

Q. Can we go and get the medicines now and have an area to put them in?

A. If this is something the community would like to do then we can help with that

Q. Can it be stated that if the plants get moved and don't take that the company doesn't say it's the community's fault if they are caring for them?

A. This issue is addressed at the IBA table but yes, this can be noted

Q. Will the plants be contaminated?

A. It will be okay to collect plants in and around the operation, monitoring will be done to ensure the health of the plants

Q. What if we have questions as things move forward?

A. This is what your consultants are here for, they are your first point of contact for issues, comments, concerns regarding the Project. IAMGOLD is also committed to ongoing consultation and engagement and have always stated that we are open to communications and community members can contact us

Q. If there was an opportunity to make a profit off of research (referring to plant revegetation), will the communities get a part of it?

A. This is not something that is done by IAMGOLD as we don't specialize in reclamation work but this would be a good business idea for the community to look at

Q. We need to do an inventory on species that are already there so we can determine what to regrow

A. This information is contained in the Vegetation Baseline document which is included in the EER and EA (original) and can be provided to you by your consultants

Participant Questions and Answers - Evening Session

Q. How far is Cote from Jerome?

A. 35 kms

Q. Where is the project location?

A. 9 km in off Sultan Road, turn off from Highway 144 onto Sultan to access is 5km

Q. Why only 25% of the site will be covered and revegetated?

A. Only the Mine Rock Area is planned to have 25% revegetated and overtime it is anticipated to fill in naturally. The remaining areas where infrastructure is removed is planned to be reclaimed and revegetated to the best achievable outcome.

Q. How much damage will there be to the waterways?

* Community members were walked through the visual presentation step by step to have the dewatering and realignment process explained

Q. Will construction and stripping not affect archaeological work being done? A. No because there has been extensive work completed since 2010 on the site and areas have been cleared. As construction and stripping is done, if anything is found work stops so the archaeologists can come in to recover any artifacts

Q. But how will the equipment operators know to stop if they uncover something A. There will be a training program included in the orientation to be able to help identify potential objects or areas of concern. An archaeologist will be available to the project as needed

Q. What is done with these things that are found? They are the property of our community, we don't want things to go missing, they are pieces of our history

A. To date every artifact that has been found has been properly catalogued and is currently in storage.

Q. I would feel better if there is a band member on site to have another pair of eyes to make sure nothing is overlooked or destroyed

A. There will be monitoring of the site during all phases of the mine, these details are in IBA negotiations and include a community member being present as well

Q. I think we would need to see the area before we can just openly say yes, go ahead and make your mine and change the area

A. There was a site visit today with Chief and Council and the Land Code committee. Future site visits can be arranged at any time with MFN staff or Chief and Council

Q. How will navigating in the area be managed during the project?

A. Navigation would not be interfered with. People could continue to use waterways with the exception of overnight camping within the project boundary.

Q. How is Mattagami involved in permitting?

A. Under the current agreement, the permits come to the community's technical team and there is a review period for the First Nation during which comments can be submitted. This has been discussed between IAMGOLD and your consultants and the information is to be posted in the administration building

Q. We should have a joint environmental working group to have the community involved in the process with our people in key positions throughout the life of the mine A. IAMGOLD has envisioned this model for a committee already and has included it in IBA negotiations

Q. When is the environmental information available? (referring to the EER)

A. It will be available and submitted to the consultants on September 10th

Q. Can we see it?

A. Yes, the package will be available to the community

Q. You're putting in a transmission line for this mine, is it always going to be there? A. Until the mine site no longer needs power the transmission line will be live and once this is no longer needed IAMGOLD will have the infrastructure removed. Unless there is an alternate use for the powerline.

Q. I don't like where you are putting the waste, how can all that rock that comes out of the hole fit in that little waste rock pile

A. The material that is in the waste rock pile is what is left over from removal of the gold so there is part of the material that is extracted that is refined, the amount left over is less than the original material removed

Q. How are you going to guarantee that no wild game can enter the tailings pond and get hurt or contaminated

A. There is no tailings pond with this design. The tailings are thickened and the water is recycled back into the facility

Q. What happens if you sell the mine?

A. Any mine who purchases it has to follow the Closure Plan submitted by IAMGOLD. They buy the mine and all the required processes for proper closure. Also the government holds financial assurity so if the company went bankrupt the government would cover the costs for closure

Q. You're saying the pit will take 30 years to fill up, will it be monitored to ensure wildlife is safe while it is filling up?

A. The pit will be fenced in so wildlife can't fall in. The site and water will be monitored regularly.

Q. How are we protected if something happens, a spill or some kind of event like that? A. Within the Closure Plan there is an Accidents & Malfunctions which accounts what to do in the event of failure of a system or problems of that nature

Q. Why isn't anyone here from Flying Post?

A. The membership was not available for this date but there is a tentative session with them later in September

Q. What happens if we have more questions past the deadlines you're talking about? A. At any time your questions can be brought to Chief & Council or your consultant and they can address your concerns and Christian and Dave (IAMGOLD) are always available to listen to concerns and feedback.

Q. How do you ensure that the tailings facility can withstand years of weather considering how climate change has been?

A. The design considers future models with climate change being a factor. This is also monitored and changes are made if need be

Q. Why is the Closure Plan reviewed only every 5 years? This seems like a long time to be watching if changes are needed

A. This timeline is necessary because there are numerous studies done and it takes time to update the information accordingly. For example, this current Closure Plan took one year to complete

Q. When you are doing updates on the Closure Plan will it be the same process as we are sitting here going through right now?

A. The process to communicate any changes and address concerns you may have can be done in a way that the community finds suitable there will be ongoing dialog.

Q. What are we going to see with these piles when it's done? What will the area look like? A. The tailings area will be 70m high and the mine rock waste pile could be up to 150m high and will be vegetated so you will see hills with vegetation on them

Q. Will traditional medicines be preserved or relocated?

A. Yes IAMGOLD would like to partner on this with the community. This would be a great business opportunity for the community to establish and supply seeds for reclamation not only for the closure of our site but other projects as well.

Q. Access to the (Cote) Site for traditional purposes and to study plant species? A. Yes access would be allowed with consent from IAMGOLD on location and purpose to ensure safety.

Additional Comments from the community during the open forum

- It's important to have a study done to determine what plant species are there, to be documented as part of the priority species to ensure they are included in the revegetation plan. Some traditional plants are only harvested once a year so if it doesn't take maybe it never will
- We need to do ceremonies to respect the water before any work is done on Cote Lake
- When picking traditional medicines, the distance I have to go to do this has already increased and with the mine it will be even further

Additional comments from the community - one on one

 IAMGOLD had some positive feedback from a land code committee member MFN - Good information but this is the first time we are hearing any of this so that's a bit frustrating, more information would be good IMG – I'm glad you came and thank you for your input. The details of this event were not clear, we were unaware we would be doing the presentation until we arrived today and saw the agenda for the first time, we were invited by the consultants to be here to answer questions if need be but luckily we came prepared with some materials just in case MFN – well in that case I'd say you did a good job
