Operational milestones

In 2024, Côté achieved nearly 200,000 ounces of production in its first year of operations. Milestones include pouring first gold on March 31, 2024, achieving commercial production on August 1, 2024, and completing a comprehensive mill shutdown in September.

Congratulations to the team, including contractors, for their relentless efforts in driving progress and to the local communities for their support. In addition, Côté closed 2024 with an impressive milestone: maintaining a record of no medical treatment injuries (MTI) for all individuals, including contractors.

The target this year is for Côté to produce 360,000 to 400,000 ounces, effectively doubling production from last year. We have the goal to achieve the steady-state nameplate throughput rate of 36,000 tpd in the fourth quarter of 2025. In December, the plant operated at an average of 87% of the designed throughput level over a two-week period, prior to an unscheduled shutdown due to a split in a conveyor belt associated with ramp-up wear and tear. When online in December, the plant averaged 1,593 tph, or effectively 106% of nameplate, with a record daily throughput of 42,635 tonnes per day.


Subsequent to quarter end, the HPGR rollers required a changeover ahead of schedule limiting the secondary crushing capacity in January. The changeover of the HPGR rolls was completed in February 2025. Inside the plant, the grinding circuit was impacted early in the quarter due to repairs required on one of the Vertimills following a faulty start-up post-maintenance. Prevention and mitigation procedures have been put in place. Plant throughput is expected to be lower in the first quarter as a result of the impact of the timing of these maintenance issues, while operating guidance has been maintained.

Exploration update

Advanced 2025 exploration on the Gosselin zone is underway with four diamond drill rigs. This 2025 drilling campaign is designed to follow-up on the successful 2024 program, with the goal of completing 45,000 metres of resource conversion and deeper delineation drilling.

The team completed construction of an addition to the Mesomikenda core shack and installed an automatic hydraulic NTT Core Saw which will provide increased productivity in an improved work environment.

To support the exploration efforts an additional 20,000 meters of diamond drilling is being planned specifically aimed at advancing ore zone continuity between the Côté mine and the Gosselin zone. Drilling operations for this initiative are set to commence by the end of March 2025. To support this, a new group, Minex, will be established as part of the local geology team.

Permitting update/ESG

IAMGOLD continues to apply for and obtain permits required to construct and operate the mine. Since December 2024, we have received the following permits:

Permit to Take Water (PTTW)

- Received new permit (No. 7620-DDBUKD) to facilitate ice road / pad construction for exploration drilling activities.
- Extended permit (No. 7826-D4LJSB) to support dewatering for ongoing construction at Clam Dam # 3, and low flow mitigation work at the Watercourse Realignment Channel (WRC) #2.

Lakes and Rivers Improvement Act

- Extended Location Approval Authorization for permit No. TM-2022-LRIA-00003 to support ongoing construction of fish offsetting habitat at Aggregate Pit #3.
- Extended permit No. 7520-2019-0327 to support ongoing construction at Clam Dam #3.

Environmental Compliance Approval (ECA) No. 4203-CY4KC8

• Limited Operational Flexibility (LOF) approval to direct the discharge of water from the Aggregate Pit #3 Fish Habitat construction area to the Polishing Pond.
