1.0 INTRODUCTION

This Summary of the May 2013 Open Houses is part of the commitment of the IAMGOLD Corporation (IAMGOLD) to inform and consult with local communities and stakeholders regarding the proposed Côté Gold Project. The Open Houses were organized by IAMGOLD to provide information about the Project and to review and seek feedback on the Draft Terms of Reference (ToR) under the Provincial Individual Environmental Assessment. This Report presents a summary of the consultation activities and feedback associated with these sessions.

2.0 CONSULTATION PROCESS

2.1 Notification of the Open Houses

Notifications of the Open Houses were provided in advance to all households in the communities of Gogama, West Tree and Shining Tree as well as the Mattagami First Nation Reserve through the Gogama Local Service Board. Notices were also mailed to all individuals on the Project Mailing List.

Notices were published in local newspapers as summarized in Table 1. Copies of the newspaper advertisements are presented in Appendix A.

Attendees were encouraged to sign a register at the door and indicate whether they would want to be placed on the Project Mailing List. A summary of the attendance at each session is presented in Table 3.

2.4 Additional Avenues for Comments

As part of the poster board displays, participants were encouraged to document any comments, concerns or questions on sticky notes and post them to blank boards in the areas of biological, physical and human environments as well as alternative assessment and consultation. The following summarizes feedback received through the sticky notes.

1. Physical Environment:

Timmins

- What about the Mesomikenda (Lake)?(cottagers-noise, water quality, fishing affected)
- Not only water quality a concern, but water quantity. (Mesomikenda is a dam lake and levels widely fluctuate.)

2. Human Environment:

Timmins

- How many employees do you expect to hire from the Timmins area?

3. Biological Environment:

Sudbury

- Circle M. Canoe route will be lost
- Lake Mesomikenda will have too much use: negative for fish & wildlife

Timmins

- Is there walleyes, pikes or trout in the immediate lakes around the tailings ponds?

4. Alternatives Assessment:

Sudbury

- Do not use lake mesomikenda for any discharge or intake.
- Move TMF and 2 Easterly mine rock areas to West of Cote Lake
- [Will there be] cyanide effects on lake water?

Timmins

- Would prefer to have more details on the boards such as identifying species (could assist the publics' understanding and ability to ask specific questions).
- Will there be water discharged from Tailing Management Facility into Mesomikenda Lake? How will it be monitored?
- Tailings boundary should be further from certain neighboring water bodies.

5. Consultation:

- Trappers for project transmission; Porcupine Prospectors and Developers Association; Sudbury Prospectors and Developers Association; Ontario Mining Association; Ontario Prospectors Association

3.0 CONCLUSION

Overall, there was a positive interest in the Project as a socio-economic benefit to the area. From the comments received, concerns were raised with respect to:

- Potential impacts to water quantity and quality (specifically related to Mesomikenda Lake);
- Potential impacts to fish and wildlife;
- Potential loss of the Circle M Canoe Route; and
- Proposed locations of the Tailings Management Facility, mine rock piles, and points of water take and (effluent) discharge.

The Process:

The first step in the Provincial environmental assessment process is the preparation of a Terms of Reference. A draft Terms of Reference has been prepared and is being issued by IAMGOLD for public comment. It sets out the framework and work plan for addressing the *Environmental Assessment Act* requirements when preparing the environmental assessment, including such things as the alternatives that will be considered, how environmental effects will be evaluated, and the proposed public consultation activities.

A final proposed Terms of Reference will be submitted to the Ministry of the Environment (the Ministry) and will be issued for a formal comment period coordinated by the Ministry. This document will consider comments received on the draft Terms of Reference. If approved by the Minister, the proposed Terms of Reference will provide the framework and requirements for the preparation of the environmental assessment.



It was fitting that Penguins owner Mario Lemieux was looking on because the goal looked a bit like the goal Lemieux scored on the Minnesota North Stars in the 1991 final.

MONTREAL — Quebec's anti-corruption unit, UPAC, carried out the biggest raids in its history Thursday, arresting 37 people including Gilles Vaillancourt, the former mayor of suburban Laval, Que.

The group faces dozens of charges including fraud, conspiracy, breach of trust and gangsterism, which would make it the largest alleged criminal organization ever run out of a

Laval, a sprawling Montreal suburb of 400,000 people, is Quebec's third-largest city.

"These are extremely serious allegations," UPAC commissioner Robert Lafreniere told a news conference.

He said 120 officers carried out 70 search warrants on Thursday, adding that roughly 30,000 conversations were wiretapped and \$438,000 was seized.

"Today's operation is a testimony of the magnitude of the

corruption phenomena we are facing. All means are put forward in order to investigate, detect and prevent corruption and collusion in our public system."

The alleged collusion in awarding municipal contracts first came to light beginning in 2010 in a series of investigative reports by QMI Agency which showed that Vaillancourt's administration had awarded more than \$25 million in untendered deals since 1998 to Dunton Rainville, a major law firm that employs a political operative close to Vaillancourt. The law firm's offices are

directly across the street from Laval City Hall.

QMI Agency also reported that the City of Laval assigned a municipal property evaluation to the Dunton Rainville office building in Laval that remained below the building's 1990 sale price for more than 17 years, while assessments for other Laval ratepayers soared.

Vaillancourt was Laval mayor for 23 years, usually facing no opposition. He resigned from the post last November saying he was "deeply hurt" by accusations levelled against him at Quebec's corruption commission.

ANALYSIS: Stock-market fluctuations are sometimes a risk you have to live with when you're saving for your retirement

How to avoid being left short

If you are saving for retirement and find that you are glued to the radio or TV when the stock market is experiencing wild and volatile movements, you may find yourself asking "why am I taking a risk by investing and not just saving in a bank account or a GIC?"

It is at times like 2001 and 2009 when we saw huge shifts of capital move from the stock market to the safety of GIC's that cement our understanding that fear of losing far outweighs our desire to gain.

The reason we invest is because we know we have to save for retirement and, in many cases, we need a decent return on our savings to achieve our goals. There were times when interest rates were so high that we could easily reach our targets with a GIC or savings account, but the days of double-digit interest rates are far behind us and they may not return for the foreseeable future.

Right now, you are lucky to get a savings rate of about 1.65%, and locking your money up for five years in a GIC can get you about 2.5% per year. These historically low rates really hit home when you go on the Bank of Canada website and see that they aim to keep inflation between 1% and 3%.

Let's face it, \$50,000 a year today is not what it used to be and, in the future, it won't be what it is today. According to the "Rule of 72" a 3% inflation rate means that your costs of living will double every 24 years (72 divided by 3 is 24).

With 3% inflation, \$50,000

today has the same purchasing power of \$25,000 24 years ago and, if you are retiring in 24 years with the same inflation rate, you will need \$100,000 per year to generate what \$50,000 would buy today.

While inflation is relatively low at this time, we are con-

stantly reminded by the Bank of Canada that it will become a significant factor down the road and interest rates will subsequently rise. If your savings target requires a return that is not keeping up with or beating inflation, then you may need to take on more risk and get used

to the ups and downs of the stock market.

CANADIANS FEEL PINCH OF 'FOOD INFLATION': POLL

Rising food prices are making Canadians cut back on other expenses and contributing to a generally negative outlook on the economy, an RBC study has found.

Consumers are feeling the "food inflation" of the past few years, which saw an increase of 2.4% last year following increases of 3.8% and 1.4% in 2011 and 2010, respectively, RBC said. It also predicts last year's drought conditions in the U.S. could send food prices up another 3-4% this year.

More than half of those surveyed (57%) said they comparison shop for food more than they used to, and 43% said they spend less on other things in order to afford the cost of groceries.

The Consumer Outlook Index also found an eight-point drop across the country in economic confidence — the first decrease in nearly two years. Just a quarter of Canadians polled (26%) said they think the economy will improve in the next year, while 30% believe it will worsen.

Ipsos Reid conducted the online survey of 3,024 respondents April 2-15. It's considered accurate within two percentage points.

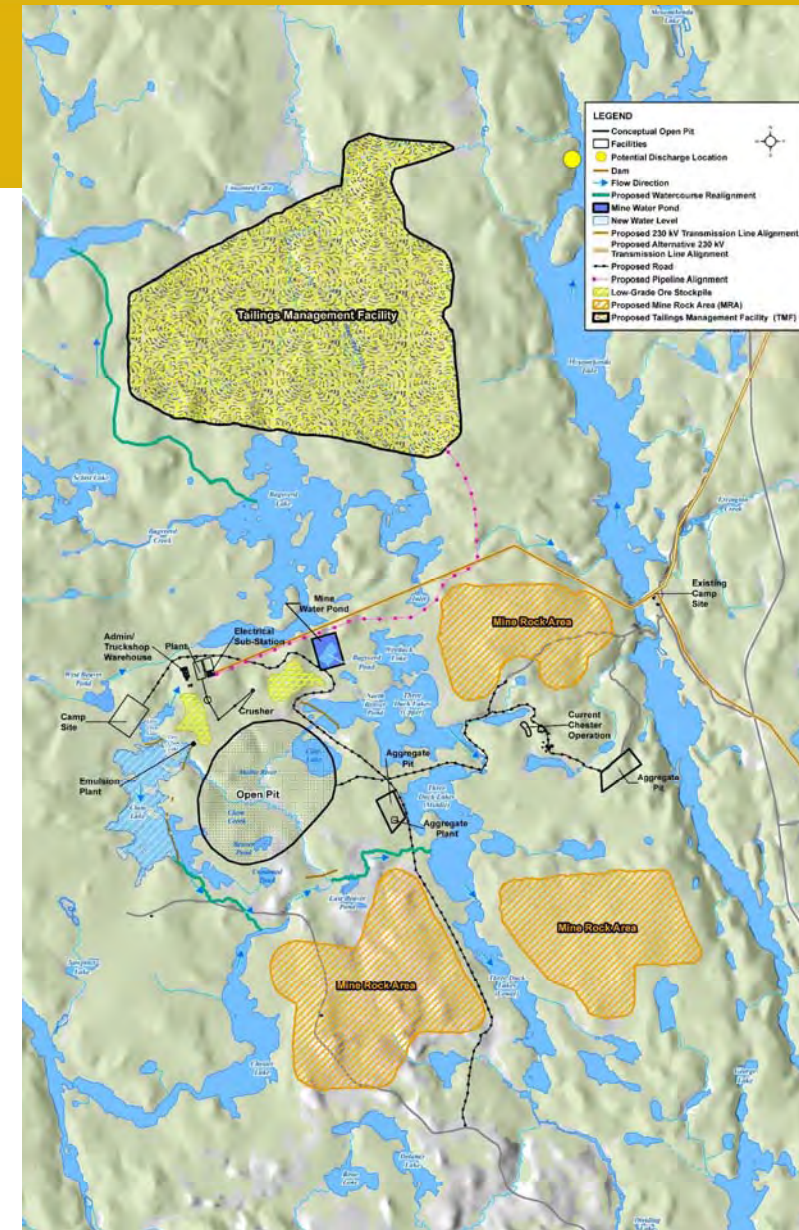

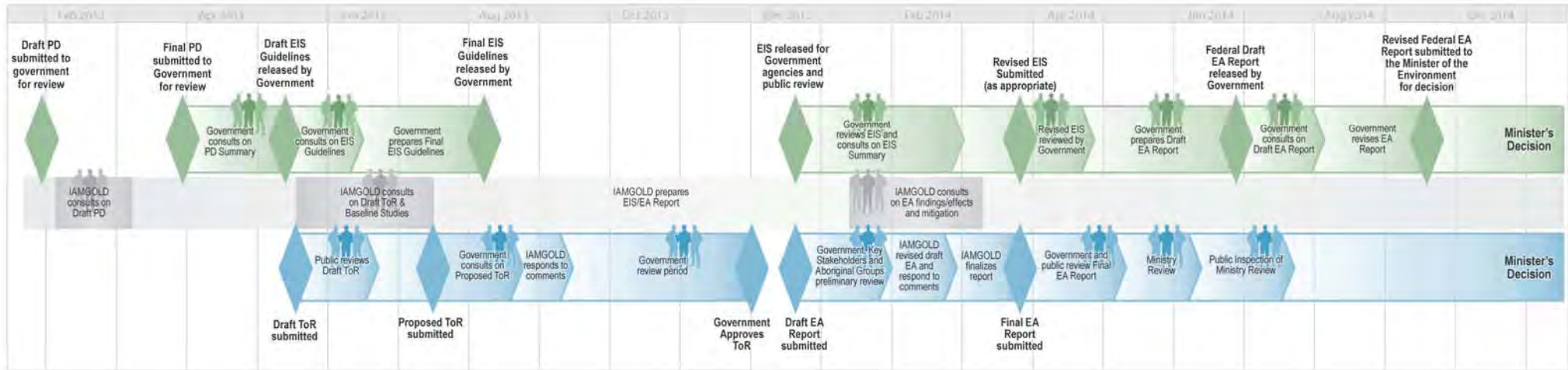
