Project is 64% complete!

As of the end of September, construction of the Côté project was approximately 64% complete and advancing well following the schedule and cost update released in the summer. With approximately 1,500 workers currently on site, the project is nearing peak capacity and has seen significant progress in the third quarter towards the target of production in early 2024.

Completing construction safely is a top priority. The project surpassed 7.5 million hours with no lost time injuries as of the end of November.

Industry recognition

We were extremely pleased to see the Mattagami First Nation fish hatchery project featured in the fall newsletter of the Mining Association of Canada. The issue, which focuses on sustainability and biodiversity conservation, features several case studies of mining companies that have invested in best-in-class biodiversity conservation initiatives.

In 2011, IAMGOLD, alongside other local mining and community partners, invested in the Mattagami First Nation fish hatchery, which focuses on



ensuring a sustainable walleye population for current and future generations. As a result of the investment, the hatchery was able to produce and release approximately 250,000 fry (young fish) in the first year and has increased this number to approximately 1,000,000 fry released annually since then.

Construction

With detailed engineering now 100% complete, progress continues to be made in virtually all areas of development. Monthly project advancement is estimated to be approximately 3-4% per month during this peak.

Earthworks activities

Earthworks activities advanced with several work fronts providing significant progress over the summer months, including the tailings management facility, water realignment channels, polishing pond dam and other water management infrastructure dams.

Processing plant and infrastructure

Construction of the processing facility has progressed well both on the exterior and interior fronts. As for the infrastructure, the overhead power line has been completed, with the exception

of connection to Hydro and the main electrical substation, which is under construction. The administration building and offices have been erected and are commissioning.

Equipment delivery

Heavy mobile equipment continues to arrive on site including CAT 793F haul trucks (11 delivered), 994 loaders (2 delivered) and D10 dozers (4 delivered) at the end of September. Autonomous Control Room completed in mid-September. Other equipment delivery is ongoing with inventory being held on site laydown and off-site at warehouses.



Côté Gold is an open pit gold mining project in northern Ontario. The Project is a joint venture between IAMGOLD Corporation and Sumitomo Metal Mining.

Permits

Key permits have been received. Remaining non-critical path permitting activities are well advanced and continue. A list of all permits applied for and received to date is available at www.iamgold.com/cotegold in the Permitting Applications section.
