### HISTORY

Caesars New Orleans, formerly known as Harrah's New Orleans Casino opened its doors in October of 1999 on Canal Street in the heart of downtown New Orleans, steps away from the historic French Quarter and Mississippi River. In 2020, Caesars Entertainment announced plans to transform Harrah's into Caesars New Orleans, and on Oct. 22, 2024, the transformation was complete, ushering in a new era after 25 years in the Big Easy.

### Caesars Hotel Tower, Harrah's Hotel and Nobu Hotel New Orleans

Now boasting nearly 800 hotel rooms between its two hotel towers – the new Caesars Tower and the original hotel tower on Poydras Street – guests can stay and play in luxury. The area's first Nobu Hotel is slated to open inside the Caesars Tower in late 2024.

### CASINO

The destination provides an extensive gaming experience with more than 150,000 square feet of upgraded gaming and dining space featuring more than 1,300 slot machines, 120 table games, a 20-table World Series of Poker Room®, three outdoor gaming courtyards and a 5,700-square-foot state-of-the-art Caesars Sportsbook.

### DINING & DRINKS

**Nobu Restaurant** – Chef Nobu Matsuhisa opens his first Louisiana restaurant at Caesars New Orleans. The menu reflects a variety of fresh fish and seafood in the form of nigiri and sashimi. Signature dishes include Yellowtail Jalapeño, featuring delicately sliced yellowtail sashimi with touches of garlic puree, adorned with jalapeño slices, crowned with cilantro and served with Japanese citrus soy sauce. Another highlight is the Black Cod Miso, prepared by marinating the fish in den miso sauce for two to three days to produce the iconic, sweet-savory flavor.

**Emeril's Brasserie and Emeril's Petite Brasserie** - is a three-meal restaurant that marries French-inspired dishes with Creole flavors, packing a punch and adding an Emeril twist on dishes guests are sure to love. The knockout menu features items such as Steak Frites Au Poivre, Kicked-Up Onion Soup and Whole Roasted Gulf Fish Court Bullion, as well as a

bountiful seafood tower and a “Mile-High” Peanut Butter Pie, which can be accompanied by a refreshing Sidecar or delicate French 75 from the full bar.

Emeril’s quick-service coffee shop and bakery, Emeril’s Petite Brasserie, adjacent to the main restaurant, is open daily starting at 7 a.m. and accessible from the casino floor.

**The Steakhouse** inside the casino offers locally sourced seafood, steaks and a wide array of wines and craft cocktails, all set to the backdrop of Blue Dog art by local artist George Rodrigue. Grab a seat at the bar or dine-in, Wednesday – Sunday night.

New Orleans football legend Archie Manning has created the ultimate sports fan’s dream: **Manning’s Sports Bar & Grill** on Fulton Street. A tailgate-inspired menu, 13-foot mega screens and an outdoor courtyard make this location the perfect spot to catch the game and grab a bite. Manning’s is open Thursday – Sunday, 11am – 10pm.

Fuel your cravings at the all-new **Celebrity Chef Food Hall** inside the casino. The food hall features New York-style pizza and fun desserts from Cake Boss, Buddy Valastro’s **PizzaCake**, delicious burgers, fries, and breakfast items from Bobby Flay’s, **Bobby’s Burgers** and Caribbean Creole fare and cocktails at **Nina’s Creole Cottage** by local chef, Nina Compton.

Enjoy authentic Vietnamese Pho Thursday – Sunday night at **2Geaux Pho Bar**.

Grab a cocktail from the stunning new center bar **Octavia**. Octavia seamlessly marries the grandeur of Ancient Rome with the enchanting spirit of the Big Easy through elegant design and sophisticated cocktails. The octagonal-shaped bar is named in homage to the honorable Octavia, niece to Julius Caesars and an emblem of strength and femininity in Roman history. Octavia offers guests an elevated experience, with a 27-seat bar and 136-seat lounge area as well as live music, 19 table games and 60 slot options. The focal point of the 13,500-square-foot room is a \$750,000 chandelier that boosts dynamic aesthetics for guests enjoying artisanal cocktails and fanciful spirits.

## ENTERTAINMENT

The Fillmore at Harrah’s New Orleans is a 22,000-square-foot event and concert venue on the second floor of the casino. Their entertainment schedule is packed full of top national and local shows, concerts and more. ## MEETING SPACE

Caesars New Orleans has nearly 21,000 square feet of flexible meeting space. **The Conference Center**, located on the second floor of the hotel, offers versatile meeting facilities, including the charming Vieux Carre Ballroom (4,095 sq. ft.), Fulton Street Rooms (2,175 sq. ft.), Board Room (355 sq. ft.), and Satchmo Room (620 sq. ft.).

**Manning’s Sports Bar & Grill** offers several different event space options to meet your needs. **The Stadium Club** is situated on the second floor of the restaurant and offers a casual, sports-theme with meeting room and a grand wrap around **balcony** (2,859 sq. ft.) overlooking a large **open-air courtyard** (1,500 sq. ft.).

**The Fulton Street Promenade** (21,246 sq. ft.) is a beautifully landscaped red bricked multifunctional outdoor space completed with a gazebo stage and surround sound for entertainment. All of the rooms are equipped with power outlets on the floor, drop-down screens, full audio/visual and Internet services.
