## 2025 Chairman's Letter

The healthcare environment continued to evolve amid complex legislative and regulatory activity across federal, state, and local governments. This year in particular, the national conversation around healthcare affordability intensified, with policymakers advancing proposals that directly affect coverage, reimbursement, prescription drug pricing, and the sustainability of public programs. In this dynamic and highly visible policy climate, constructive and principled participation in the public policy arena is essential to advancing practical solutions, supporting our business objectives, strengthening the communities we serve, and ensuring access to high-quality, affordable care.

At Elevance Health, we approach political engagement with a strong commitment to accountability and responsible governance. Transparency with our members, customers, associates, shareholders, and the public is foundational to how we conduct these activities. Each year, the Governance Committee of our Board of Directors oversees and reviews our political strategy, contributions, and related efforts to confirm alignment with our internal standards and compliance framework.

We are pleased to have maintained our "Trendsetter" designation from the CPA-Zicklin Index, which evaluates political spending disclosure and oversight among S&P 500 and Russell 1000 companies. This highest-level distinction reflects the strength of our governance practices and our continued leadership in transparency.

This year's report offers a closer look into Elevance Health's approach, highlighting:

- Principles and policies for engaging in the public policy process;
- lobbying expenditures at both federal and state levels;
- trade association dues exceeding \$50,000 annually, and
- contributions made by Elevance Health PAC and corporate political contributions to candidates, committees, PACs, ballot initiatives, and 527 organizations.

By publishing this report each year, we reinforce our dedication to ethical conduct, responsible engagement, and clear disclosure. We remain focused on promoting thoughtful dialogue around key healthcare issues and supporting policies that enable innovation, sustainability, and improved health outcomes nationwide.

# Core Principles for Participation in the Public Policy Process

At Elevance Health, our participation in the public policy process is open, transparent and based on reasons that are clear and justifiable to our associates, customers, shareholders, and the public. Such participation is grounded by the company's commitment to strong corporate governance and guided by the following core principles:

- Corporate participation in the public policy process is an essential means of enhancing customer and shareholder value and is fundamental to free and democratic societies.
- The company's public policy priorities and positions are developed in close partnership with leaders from across the company and are guided by our Purpose, Strategy, and Values.
- Elevance Health works with elected and government officials, industry peers and trade associations, the broader business community, customers, and the general public to advocate for public policies that align with the company's core business priorities and goals.
- In general, Elevance Health supports and engages on public policies that are critical to the company's core business and improving the healthcare system including promoting competition and free markets in healthcare delivery and financing and advocating a role for the private sector in public programs.
- Management of Elevance Health's participation in the public policy process is the responsibility of the senior vice president of Public Affairs in accordance with the company's enterprise risk management framework. This position reports directly to the Chief Legal Officer and is responsible for providing regular updates to the Elevance Health Board of Directors.
- All costs associated with the company's engagement in the public policy process, including permissible political contributions and lobbying expenditures, are included in an Annual Plan, which is subject to the approval and oversight of the company's Board of Directors.
- Elevance Health associates who engage in the public policy process on behalf of the company, or independently on their own time, must comply with the company's ethics and compliance requirements identified in the Elevance Health's Code of Conduct.



# Public Policy Priorities

In general, Elevance Health engages on public policies that align with the company's core business priorities. Examples of these priorities include:

- Expanding access to healthcare coverage,
- Advancing healthcare affordability,
- Improving the quality of care and outcomes, and
- Reducing health disparities.

These priorities are identified by business leaders and growth partners across the enterprise during the annual planning process. Public Affairs serves as a strategic partner to the company's business units, to assist in meeting their annual and long-term strategic growth plans, and regularly meets with business unit leaders to determine prioritization of public policies based on market and political dynamics.

The company's engagement on these priority issues includes direct lobbying and advocacy, political contributions, grassroots engagement, and trade association membership.

## Lobbying

As part of Elevance Health's broader engagement in the public policy process, the company engages in lobbying activities with elected officials and others in federal, state, and local governments to advocate for public policies that align with the company's core business priorities and goals.

Elevance Health's relationships with public policymakers, including members of Congress, governors, state legislators, and regulators are key to the company's advocacy success. These relationships help ensure policymakers are aware of how their decisions impact the company's ability to deliver better care and improve the healthcare system.

In 2025, Elevance Health spent approximately \$5 million\* on state lobbying activities and \$7.47 million\* on federal lobbying activities.

Elevance Health's senior vice president of Public Affairs has oversight for all lobbying activities and expenditures. Other members of the Public Affairs organization involved with lobbying include the vice presidents of State Affairs, Public Policy & Issues Management, and Federal & External Affairs, and their direct reports.

Elevance Health complies with all lobbying disclosure requirements as prescribed by state and federal law. Lobbying activities generally include communications with elected federal, state, and local officials, agency officials, or other legislative and regulatory officials for the purpose of influencing legislative or administrative actions.

<sup>1</sup> State laws vary on how they define lobbying activity, expenses and what is reportable. For purposes of this report, state lobbying expenses include approximate percentages of associate compensation, overhead, outside lobbying consultant fees, and state trade association dues. Elevance Health's tax Department tracks these fees, and the amount in this report is a preliminary amount based on provisional quarterly tax filings for 2024.

# Political Contributions

As part of Elevance Health's broader participation in the public policy process, the company sponsors nonpartisan political action committees including Elevance Health, Inc. Political Action Committee ("Elevance Health PAC") to make contributions to federal, state, and local candidates and committees, as allowed by law. Elevance Health provides a voluntary opportunity for eligible associates, as defined by federal and state law, to support the company's engagement in political activities. Elevance Health PAC's contributions are made in accordance with an annual budget that is overseen and approved by the Elevance Health PAC Board of Directors.

While federal law prohibits Elevance Health from making corporate contributions to federal candidates, the company makes direct contributions to support state and local candidates, political parties, political action committees, independent expenditure committees, ballot measures and in-kind contributions in states where such corporate contributions are allowed by law.

Political contributions by Elevance Health with corporate dollars and by PACs sponsored by the company reflect the company's interests, including public policy priorities and positions, and not the personal views or beliefs of individual officers, directors, or associates.

Elevance Health does not and will not make political contributions based on party affiliation, contributions made in previous election cycles, or Board, executive, or client pressure.

No political contribution will be made in anticipation of, in recognition of, or in return for an official act, as Elevance Health adheres to all federal, state, and local laws and regulations governing the public policy process. This includes communications with elected federal and state officials, agency officials, or other legislative and regulatory officials for the purpose of influencing legislative or administrative action. Elevance Health utilizes established internal policies and procedures to ensure compliance with these requirements and to ensure political activities are conducted in accordance with high ethical standards.

All political contributions go through a legal review process and are reviewed and approved by the company's senior vice president of Public Affairs. Elevance Health complies with all applicable federal and state laws and regulations related to the disclosure of political contributions with the Federal Election Commission and applicable state campaign finance offices. Elevance Health provides additional transparency of political contributions and related activities through the publication of mid-year and annual reports on the company's corporate website.

Certain criteria are considered when making PAC and corporate political contributions, including the following, which are reviewed, at least annually, and endorsed by the Governance Committee of the company's Board of Directors:

- Support for public policy that promotes private competition, choice and free markets in the delivery and financing of healthcare, a role for the private sector in public programs, and is in the best long-term interest of the company, its customers, and its shareholders
- Totality of voting record or announced positions on public policies that impact the company's core business, including through whole-health solutions, digital platforms, and public-private partnerships

- Leadership position, or likelihood of holding such a position in the future, including on key committees of importance to the company
- Representation of a state or district where the company has a large concentration of associates and/or customers
- Impact of a contribution on the campaign
- Maintaining a relative partisan balance
- No political contributions will be made in support of the race for U.S. President or to the Republican National Committee or Democratic National Committee.

The Governance Committee of the company's Board of Directors reviews, at least annually, the company's political strategy, political contributions, and activities and oversees compliance with the company's policies and procedures regarding political contributions and activities. The risks associated with political and lobbying activities are managed in accordance with the company's enterprise risk management framework. In addition, the company's Internal Audit Department assesses the risk related to political giving within its annual risk assessment process, has performed reviews in the past and will perform additional reviews as deemed appropriate.

The contributions listed in this report include direct and in-kind corporate and PAC contributions to federal and state political candidates, political parties, political action committees, independent expenditure committees, ballot measure committees, and other 527 political entities. Elevance Health makes limited contributions to organizations organized as a 501c(4).

Note: Elevance Health did not make any direct independent expenditures or contributions to Super PACs in 2025. Any contributions to state independent expenditure committees are included in the list of contributions.

## Grassroots

Another element of Elevance Health's engagement in the public policy process includes a grassroots platform (Elevance Health ACT) that provides a voluntary opportunity for the company's associates to learn about and advocate for policy and regulatory issues that impact the company's core business.

# Trade Association Memberships

Like most major corporations, Elevance Health is a member of several national and state industry and business trade associations (organized under section 501(c)(6) of the Internal Revenue Code) to help advance the company's public policy priorities.

Elevance Health believes that membership in these associations is consistent with the company's interests and plays a valuable role in bringing a collective voice to the public policy process. Elevance Health also understands that not all members of an association will come to agreement on every issue. Elevance Health directly communicates its public policy positions to trade associations to inform their positioning; however, those associations may take positions that do not reflect the company's position, or they may take positions on issues for which Elevance Health has not taken a position.

Elevance Health believes that membership in such associations is worthwhile because they provide a venue that encourages dialogue and an opportunity to reach industry consensus on important policy issues. Elevance Health performs a thorough assessment of association memberships each year to determine alignment and value. Payments to industry and business trade associations are subject to the same "Core Principles for Participation in the Public Policy process" and Governance Committee oversight.

Included in this report is a list of the national and state industry and business trade associations the Elevance Health paid membership dues in the amount of \$50,000 or more in 2025, including the portion allocated to non-deductible lobbying activity and political expenditures.
