## **Corporate Political Contributions**

Our <u>Policy on Political Contributions</u> states that, in rare cases, we can make financial contributions to candidates for office. **We made no such corporate contributions in 2023.** Such contributions must be made in compliance with any and all applicable laws and must be approved by the Senior Vice President of Government Affairs, in consultation with appropriate members of JetBlue senior leadership. The Senior Vice President of Government Affairs and Associate General Counsel provides periodic updates to the Board of Directors on JetBlue's political activities, including any corporate contributions.

## **Trade Association Memberships**

JetBlue is a member of three industry trade associations, Airlines for America (A4A), International Air Transport Association (IATA), and Association of Latin American Airlines (ALTA). We have committed to disclose trade association memberships where JetBlue pays more than \$25,000 in annual dues. Contributions made by JetBlue PAC are funded entirely by the voluntary contributions of JetBlue crewmembers, and no corporate funds are used. JetBlue PAC files reports with the Federal Election Commission which are publicly available and provide an itemization of receipts and disbursements.
