Quick facts

- In 2025, we expect to take delivery of 50 new aircraft including 38 mainline and 12 regional aircraft. Mainline deliveries include 21 737 MAX 8s, 11 787-9s, 5 A321XLRs and 1 A321neo. For regionals, we plan to accept 12 E175s in 2025.
- Earlier this year, American introduced its new long-haul premium Flagship Suite® seats, featuring privacy doors on 787-9 deliveries. These new Flagship interiors will also be coming on A321XLR aircraft that start delivering later this year.
- American currently operates the youngest fleet among U.S. network carriers given the significant fleet renewal efforts the Company has taken on since 2013.

A look to the future

- As of the end of June 2025, American has more than 400 aircraft on order delivering into the next decade.
- American will introduce its new long-haul premium Flagship Suite® seats, featuring privacy doors, on all A321XLR and 787-9 deliveries.
- In 2024, American ordered 260 new aircraft as part of its continued investment in its fleet to support the long-term strength of the airline's domestic and short-haul international network.
