American Airlines gets game day ready with largest-ever football schedule for fans

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- Football fans can get a head start on their game plan for fall with expanded flights on more than 80 routes this football season, spanning both professional and college games.
- The airline's unique AAdvantage PerksSM sweepstakes program blends the love of travel with the love of football.

FORT WORTH, Texas — The matchups are set and American is ready for the season with a full slate of routes for fans to get straight to the end zone. This year, the airline will add a record-breaking 23,000 additional seats for fans, building on its already robust fall schedule offering more seats than any other airline in the U.S.
